CHAPTER THIRTEEN Your Legacy: Tomorrow's Teams

RECAP

- The biggest reason to leave a legacy is our responsibility to prepare those who remain after us for when we are not there. Jesus is our prime example. In the limited time we have, we must maintain an evergrowing vision for what God will accomplish through others when we are no longer on the scene.

DISCUSSION STARTERS

- 1. “Follow Me.” The author boldly informs the reader that “Whether you acknowledge it or not, others are watching you and following you.”
 - a. Does this statement excite you or frighten you?
 - b. Are you pleased that others would pattern themselves after your life?
 - c. If not, what can be done personally to improve the pattern?
- 2. “I will make you.” The author admonishes the reader to “actively shape their lives.”
 - a. As a parent, it is your responsibility to ‘actively shape’ your children. Discuss what that means to you.
 - b. As a parishioner, opportunity to ‘actively shape’ your fellow believers. How do you respond to such?
 - c. As a professional, it is your privilege to ‘actively shape’ your colleagues and customers. How do you balance your professional life and your role as a soul-winner?
- 3. “Fishers of men.” The author encourages you to “equip someone to be a soul winner.” This is a fulfillment of Jesus’ command to ‘preach the gospel’ and ‘disciple’. Discuss the process of becoming a soul-winner and disciple-maker.
- 4. Your personal legacy: Are you committed to simply creating the way people remember you or replicating yourself in those you leave behind?
